Consider Serving Your Community On The Cascade Locks City Council: Four Positions up for election in November: Mayor – two year term. Three Councilor positions – four year terms. Candidates must have been a resident of the City for a continuous period of 12 months immediately preceding the election and must continue residency during the term of office. Candidates must be registered to vote within the City for 12 continuous months immediately preceding the election. Candidates cannot be a candidate in a single election for more than one elective office and cannot serve simultaneously in more than one public elective office. Election packets available at City Hall or at www.cascade-locks.or.us. Deadline to file for Mayor or City Councilor is 6:00PM, August 27, 2024.

Public Safety, Fire Abatement: For the welfare and safety of our community, Ordinance 344 states, (a) The owner, person in possession or the agent of the owner of any tract or parcel of land improved or unimproved shall, on and after May 1 of each year, keep, cut and remove therefrom all dead bushes, dead trees, stumps and other items likely to cause fire and to spread fire, and shall cause the grass and vegetation to be cut to a height of less than ten inches at least once each year after May 1 and before July 15. Please keep your property free and clear of combustible material such as tall grass, brush & dead trees or bushes and free of debris. Your cooperation in this matter contributes to the safety and health of our community.

Summer Irrigation Rates: will be in effect from May 1 – October 20. The sewer rate will remain at \$45.40 per month regardless of water consumption. The water rate is \$2.50 per 1,000 gallons of water consumed.

<u>Community Secure Drug Take Back Receptible:</u> Dispose of unwanted, expired or surplus medications easily and quickly. A secure container has been installed in the Justice Court lobby, 440 SW WaNaPa Street, next door to the Columbia Market store. Unwanted medication can be dropped off Monday – Friday, 8AM to 5PM. Please do not flush unwanted or unused medications down the toilet. Flushing means they can get in the ground water system and impact fish, wildlife or even you.

<u>Hood River County Dog License Available at City Hall Office:</u> Bring a copy of current rabies vaccination and a spay or neuter certificate, if applicable. The license is good for 1 year from the date of purchase. Fertile Dogs are \$30, \$20 for senior citizens. Spayed or neutered dogs are \$15, \$8 for senior citizens. Dogs under 6 months of age are not required to be licensed. If you have any questions, please contact Hood River County Animal Control at 541-387-7037. <u>City of Cascade Locks, Did you know</u>? The City of Cascade Locks was incorporated June 1935. The first Meeting of the City Council was on September 9, 1935. Charles Nelson was the first Mayor. The Council passed 5 Ordinances, set the salary of the City Recorder, \$25.00 per month and the salary of the Treasurer at \$12.00 per month. They appointed members to the Budget Committee and chose two Council Members, Perras and Millsap to find a suitable place for the Council to meet. At the September 30th meeting, GC Powers of Portland was retained to make the preliminary survey for the new water system at a cost not to exceed \$500.
