Audit Status: The City is required to conduct a financial audit each year to insure compliance with Government Accounting Standards. Due to various issues the City has fallen behind with the reporting. We have just completed the 2022-23 Audit. The 2023-24 Audit should be completed by July. The 2024-25 audit should be completed by October. That will put the City back on track for the 2025-26 audit.

Meetings: The City Council holds its regular meetings on the 2nd and 4th Monday of each month. The Council will meet on April 13 and April 27. Please submit any written comment to the City Administrator (cityadministrator@cascade-locks.or.us) prior to 3:00 p.m. on the day of the meeting. Recycling: Recycling will be picked up by Hood River Garbage on April 1, 15, and 29.

Curbside Pickup of Yard debris April 6: The City Public Works Crew will pick up yard debris only for free beginning on Monday, April 6. We will start at the west end of town. Place yard debris piles in an area easily accessed by the backhoe and dump truck. Do not place yard debris in plastic bags. Piles placed after April 6 will not be picked up. Questions? Spring Dumpster Days, Saturday, May 2, 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. or until the dumpsters are full. The first 3 cubic yards are free. Each additional cubic yard is \$16. No hazardous waste, refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners or tires are accepted. The dumpsters are located at the Wastewater Treatment Plant, 105 NE Herman Creek Lane. Proof of residency is required. If someone else is hauling for you, pick up a Dump Coupon at City Hall Front Desk. For more information call City Hall.

Attention Online Payment Customers: View your utility invoice, print a copy, or review your account history. Payments for utility bills can be made online. Xpress Bill Pay offers online payment options. There is a 3% transaction fee on debit and credit card payments. Electronic checks will be assessed a \$1.00 fee no matter the amount of the payment. Energy Efficiency Services Rebate Program: Energy Efficiency Services offers rebates to our residential and commercial customers on a variety of appliances, heating/cooling sources, smart thermostats, construction projects like replacing windows, doors, insulation and on new manufactured homes. Garbage Service is Mandatory within the City Limits: City Ordinance No. 457 states that *all persons residing or doing business within the City of Cascade Locks shall be a customer and user of the City approved solid waste disposal program*. Contact Hood River Garbage Service at 541-386-2272. There are several service options to choose from.

2026 Burn Permits: Permits are available at City Hall Office. Permits are \$10 and are valid for the calendar year. Currently, burning is allowed from dawn until dusk for permitted burn barrels or piles 10 feet in diameter. Did you miss the curbside Yard Debris Pickup? Cascade Locks residents can dump **yard debris only** at the City Burn Pile on the last Thursday of the month (April 30) from 12:30 to 3:30 p.m. The burn pile is located at the City Wastewater Treatment Plant, 105 NE Herman Creek Lane.

What should you do if you see a streetlight that is not working?

Please identify the location of the pole (physical address) and the pole ID number. Then call City Hall to give the information to the front desk. The receptionist will fill out a service order and forward it to the City Light crew. They will get it fixed as soon as possible.
